FROM INTELLIGENT LAND USE TO SUSTAINABLE MUNICIPALITIES

Throughout the Covid-19 measures, the project will be unfolding until the end of May 2021.



Project consortium successfully attended the 4th Steering Committee Meeting in Switzerland, Zerne, and completed the site visits on the project's three thematic fields in Terra Raetica (CH, A, I).

The main topic of the meeting was the versatile Toolbox "Less Land Take", which is being prepared for the main stakeholders of the project!

The Toolbox will merge the existing information on projects, best practices, laws, and publications concerning the

topic of soil conservation in the Alpine Region.

A new addition to the project!

Publications on “scenarios” linking climate crisis and spatial planning, both for all three fields and pilot project regions will be included in the online Toolbox “Less Land Take”!

With the discussion round by stakeholders from Switzerland, we will take into account their concerns, questions, criticisms, and compliments, to make and re-design the Toolbox as convenient as possible for all key users! It is crucial that we tailor the Toolbox, especially to the final users as much as possible.

On the site visits in Terra Raetica, we learned how the stakeholders, including farmers, manage the water systems in the Alps, by using a new irrigation system,

which allows a more targeted and efficient water usage, e.g. drinking water system of the community has been renewed and better connected in light of increasing water shortages due to climate change!

We gained a deeper insight into the Inner development of the municipality, e.g. their revitalization project of old town buildings.

In Switzerland, we saw peatlands that were affected by climate change and unregulated farming practices that are now protected by renaturation projects which have also been implemented in cooperation with the agricultural sector to reach a consensus for the future of the peatlands.

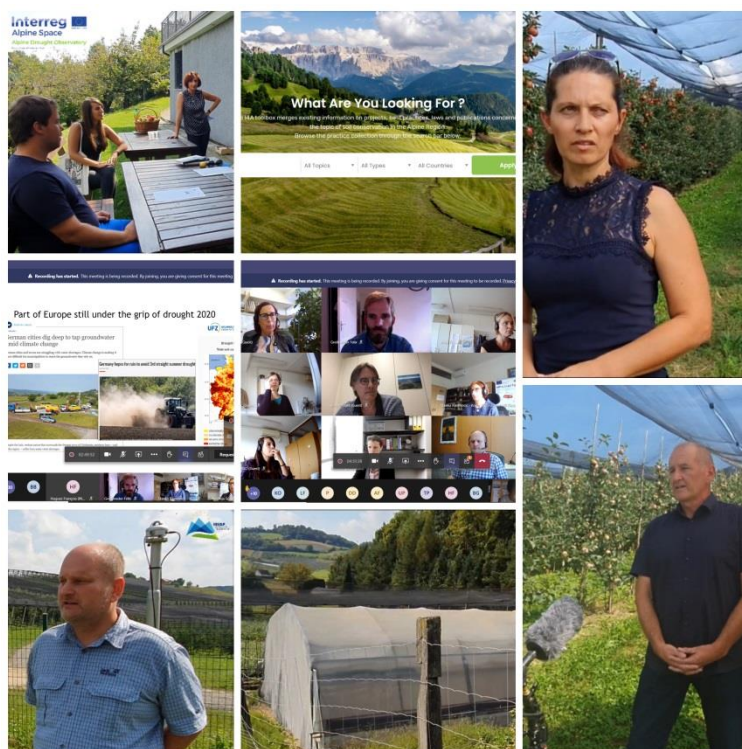
It is crucial to share examples of good practices among the various stakeholders, to gain new knowledge, to recognize new flexible approaches to the environment, and especially soil protection.

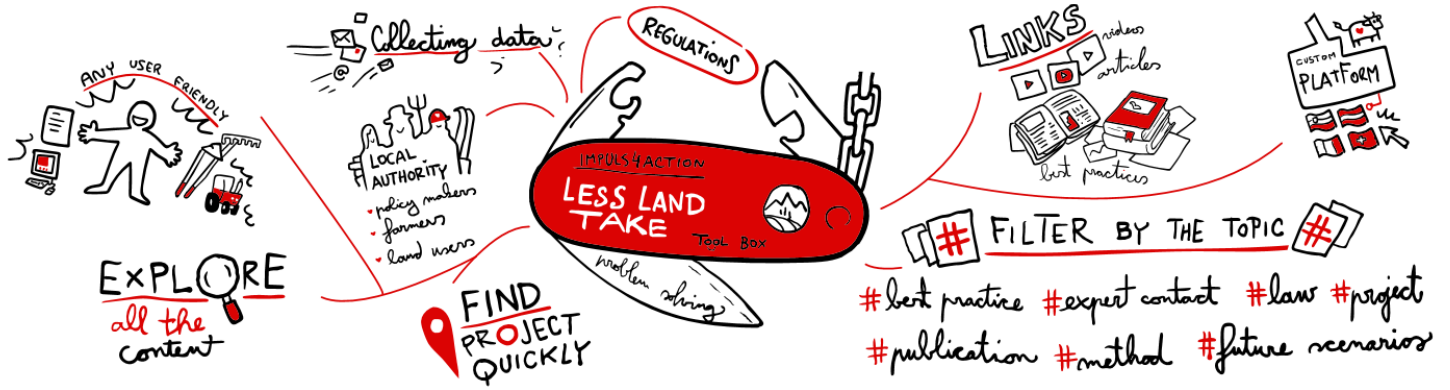
SYNERGY OF TWO PROJECTS:

With workshops the needs of target groups and relevant stakeholders are analysed. They provide the basis for the structure of the toolbox, which is the part of the

Platform of Knowledge (PoK). The establishment of the toolbox merges existing information, integrates results of on-going projects and creates cooperation starting from awareness raising events to involvement of all stakeholders concerned. The comprehensive approach on the sustainable soil protection is based on dialogue of different stakeholders, target groups and policy makers on local and regional level and it contributes to improve mutual understanding and harmonize interests.
